1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background to the Launch of Program

The Agbogbloshie E-waste Recycling Project Phase 1 was first initiated in November 2013, which later culminated in the launch of the Copper Recovery Equipment with an impressive event which took place on the 9th October 2014. The objective of the first phase of the project was to eliminate burning of cables at the site. The introduction of the wire stripping machines will enhance the value of Copper and Aluminium extracted from the cables for sale thus improving upon the livelihood of the e-scrap workers. The lead stakeholders involved in the project are Blacksmith Institute of New York, Greater Accra Scrap Dealers Association (GASDA) and National Youth Authority (NYA).

1.2 Preparation and Organisation

Canopies were put up and chairs arranged outside of the facility. A banner was hung on the gates of the containerised facility and a billboard put up close to the entrance of the scrap site. Pictures were put up on boards whilst tables were laid out for different purposes. The tables displayed handheld wire stripping tools, a television to show tools being used to strip wire cables and cocktails.

1.3 Programme Commencement

Guests were welcomed to the event with drumming and array of cultural dances performed by the Dromo Naa Folkloric Dance Ensemble. The event was held in two parts. The first part took place outside the facility under the canopies and consisted of cultural display, speeches and drama. The second part included the opening of the facility, exhibition, demonstration, media interaction, photographs and cocktails which took place within the facility. The event officially started at 10:30 am with a cultural dance staged by Dromo Naa Dance Ensemble and after a welcome address by the Executive Director of Green Advocacy Ghana/ Country Coordinator for the Blacksmith Institute Mr Yaw Amoyaw Osei.

In his welcome statement, he underscored the role that the Agbogbloshie E-scrap Site played in the recycling of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) generated by households and



institutions in the country. He bemoaned the hazardous practices associated with e-waste recycling in Agbogbloshie especially the burning of cables to extract copper wires, which poses risks to the environment and human health. He indicated that the new facility will help resolve the burning problems at the site and also go a long way to assist the over 3,000 e-scrap workers. He was hopeful that the facility will be scaled-up to accommodate the large quantities of e-waste that finds its way into Agbogbloshie.

1.4 Chairperson's Address

The event was under the chairmanship of Dr. Edith Clarke. In her address, she reiterated concerns earlier expressed by Green Advocacy's Executive Director indicating that the issue of E-waste recycling can be considered as a double edged sword, in that while it is a means of livelihood for its workers and dependants, its practices poses grave environmental and human health risk. She recalled the study conducted at Agbogbloshie Scrap Site in 2009 which revealed high levels of heavy metals in blood and urine samples taken. She noted that the presence of such heavy metals can cause lung, liver and kidney diseases leading to death.

She stressed on the need to address the occupational health and safety of workers at Agbogbloshie E-Scrap Site as well as promulgation of a law to prohibit the burning of hazardous waste materials. She was elated about the launch of the facility and hoped that the equipment would be well maintained.

1.5 Drama by School Children

Children from the Environmental Club of Queensland International School put up a drama display titled 'Wahala dey Agbogbloshie'. The play depicted the day to day activities at Agbogbloshie Scrap Site and the health effects of pollution associated with cable wire burning.

2.0 STATEMENTS OF SUPPORT

Representatives from the Ministry of Environment, Science, Technology and Innovation, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), GASDA, GRATIS Foundation, NYA and Blacksmith Institute took turns to deliver supporting statements.

2.1 Statement by the Ministry of Environment Science Technology and Innovation (MESTI)

The Deputy Minister, Hon. Dr. Bernice Heloo felt greatly honoured that she had been invited to be present at the launching of the copper recovery machines to eliminate burning at the Agbogbloshie E-Waste scrap yard. She intimated that the Ministry was pleased about this laudable idea conceived and developed by Blacksmith Institute. She extolled the collaborative efforts of Green Advocacy Ghana, NYA, GASDA and the Global Alliance on Health and Pollution for working together amidst various challenges to bring the project to its present status.

She went on to express the Ministry's displeasure about the extent of pollution that the current informal e-waste recycling practices at Agbogbloshie Scrap Yard especially the toxic fumes that emanate from the burning of cables. She stated that MESTI was concerned about serious health risk that the e-waste workers as well the businesses and traders in and around Agbogbloshie were exposed to.

Dr. Heloo furthermore added that the Ministry confirms their association with the Project and would provide any needed support to ensure its success. Also, MESTI would like to see this initiative rapidly developed and expanded for possible replication in other urban centers. She entreated all responsible citizens and corporate bodies to release their end-of-life WEEE for proper recycling and encouraged the media to support this noble venture.

In conclusion, the Deputy Minister said one major challenge associated with the launching of such useful equipment is the maintenance of the equipment to maximize its usage.

2.2 Statement by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) representative

The Director, Chemicals Control at EPA, Mr John Pwamang, thanked the Blacksmith Institute and Green Advocacy for making this dream possible. He admonished GASDA and its members to desist from burning cables which was a major source of pollution and encouraged them to make good use of the wire-stripping equipment.

He appealed to organisations such as the World Bank and other partners to join hands to raise funds to move the project a step further. He noted that this equipment was a sure start to put the burning problems of Agbogbloshie to the back burner. On behalf of the Agency, he expressed EPA's profound gratitude to Blacksmith Institute and GreenAd for making this project see the light of day.

2.3 Statement by the Greater Accra Scrap Dealers Association (GASDA) representative

The GASDA Secretary, Mr Mohammed Alihu, expressed gratitude to the neighbouring businesses whose concerns regarding the site as well as efforts of the lead partners had culminated in the coming to fruition of the project. He indicated that GASDA supplies about 30,000 metric tons of ferocious



metals to industries and expressed concern about the environmental polluting activities that are synonymous with recycling of metals at the site. He expressed gratitude to GreenAd and Blacksmith for their initiatives and ingenuity throughout the years. He ended by appealing to government to support GASDA by bringing unused cables to the site to be recycled and indicated GASDA's readiness to improve upon its operations.

2.4 Statement by the Ghana Regional Appropriate Technology Industrial Service (GRATIS Foundation)

The Chief Executive Officer of GRATIS Foundation expressed delight of GRATIS to be collaborating with the other project partners. He gave a brief background about the operations of the organization and indicated that GRATIS would be happy to fabricate and maintain components/equipment to make e-waste recycling environmentally friendly. He gave the assurance in the light of the fact that a lot of discussion had gone on and some some feasibility studies done to help design and develop appropriate technology that would be required by the project in future phases.

2.5 Statement by National Youth Authority (NYA)
